Please be aware that our children are back in school, so be careful around all school zones, stop at all stop signs and do not pass a stopped school bus! The safety of our children is always a priority.

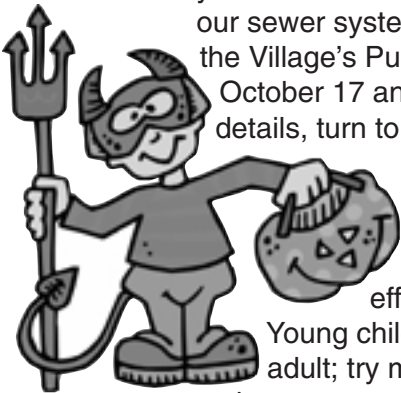
Rumors

Road Work

As you may have noticed, work has begun on several Village streets. This is a new process called "heat scarifying and asphalt modifier." We're working on the following streets now: Boeger (Dickens to Roosevelt), Boeger (Canterbury to 22nd), Boeger Court, Shaw, Shakespeare, Shelly, Shelly Court, Mandel, Mandel Court, Canterbury, Raleigh, Lancaster, Kingston and Nelson. Our sincere thanks go out to Congressman Danny Davis for securing \$750,000 and to Congressman Dan Lipinski for \$224,000 in funding for Village street improvements.

Economic Development

Our Economic Development Committee has been meeting with Focus Groups to discuss the future of the Village of Westchester. We will tell you more about this effort in future newsletters. Your patience is key as we take these steps to move forward.

Corridor Grant

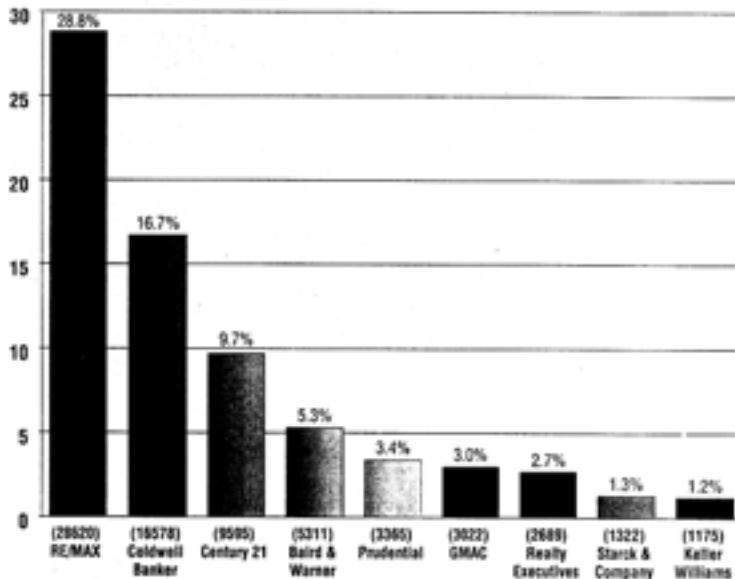

WESTCHESTER VILLAGE CODE

The Westchester Village Code is now available online at www.westchester-il.org. Note that the Code is updated once a year and should be used as a reference only. Please call the Building Department at 708-345-0020 if you have any questions.

The following two ordinances, passed this year, might be of particular interest to residents:

05-1662: An ordinance establishing a temporary moratorium on establishment of non-retail tax generating businesses on the first story of any business district in the Village of Westchester.

05-1674: An ordinance amending the Village Code to increase the real estate transfer fee from \$75 to \$150.

STRAY PETS

The Village of Westchester impounds stray pets at Hillchester Animal Hospital. If you find a domestic

animal, please contact the Police Department. Proof of rabies vaccination is required to claim lost pets. Keep in mind that nursing kittens have a better chance of survival if they remain with their mother! Mother cats leave kittens unattended frequently and return when it is safe. Also, unclaimed animals are available to loving owners. To inquire about stray pets, call Hillchester at 708-449-6300.

DO YOU NEED FLOOD INSURANCE?

On June 2, 2005, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) adopted new Flood Insurance Rate maps. Limits of the flood plain have been expanded and many of our residents have received phone calls from lenders informing them of their need to obtain flood insurance. Recycling Bins.

Residents should imprint their address on their recycling bins to help prevent the "mysterious" disappearance of bins!

After-hours Payments.

Use the drop box in the lobby of the Village Hall, located in the main lobby just to the left of the doorway into the Village offices after hours.

From the Building Department.

Village ordinance requires all properties being sold to be inspected by the Building Department prior to sale. Rental agents/owners must be registered with the Village; all single-family homes and apartments are to be inspected prior to rental; all common areas of apartment buildings are inspected once per year. For details, call the Westchester Village Hall at 345-0020.

New Vehicle Stickers go on sale December 1, 2005

Newly-acquired vehicles must be licensed within thirty (30) days of purchase. If vehicle stickers are not properly displayed by February 15, 2006, the owner is subject to a fine, in addition to fees being doubled.

Seniors: \$10 to seniors age 65 by 2/15/06. One per person. Dog tags are \$3 until February 28, 2006 and \$4 beginning March 1st. Cat tags are \$4. Newly-acquired dogs and cats must be licensed within 30 days after receiving their first rabies vaccine. Rabies certification must be presented upon registration. The Village Hall will be open for your convenience on Saturdays, February 4 and 11, from 9 am-noon. Village Hall office hours are Monday thru Friday, 8:30 am to 5 pm.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency is sponsoring a Household Hazardous Waste Collection on **Saturday, October 15, 8 am to 3 pm** at the Brookfield Zoo North Parking Lot. Acceptable wastes are: oil-based paints, paint thinner, insecticides, pesticides, solvents, Mercury, household batteries, automotive fluids, cleaning products, fluorescent bulbs, thermostats, cell phones and eyeglasses. There are some items you should NOT bring, such as latex paints, fireworks, medical waste, propane tanks, smoke detectors and fire extinguishers.

2 blood drives coming up in october, november

It's time again for Westchester's life savers to step forward. The Westchester Blood Program will hold its last two drives of the year over the next 30 days.

The organization has collected 363 units so far this year to help maintain safe supplies at Chicago area hospitals.

The village's final two drives will be **Saturday, October 22**, from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Community Center and **Monday, November 14**. As an experiment, this last drive of 2005 will be held in the evening, from 4 to 9 p.m. in a LifeSource Blood Services coach parked in the south lot of Westchester Community Church UCC, 1840 Westchester Blvd. (A donor cannot take part in both drives—just pick one!)

Following the October 22nd drive, two donors or volunteers will win gift cards contributed by the Friday's restaurant on Butterfield Road (and possibly from other restaurants) through a random drawing of names. After each of the drives this year, the Blood Program has thanked donors by giving away "door prizes" contributed by area restaurants or businesses. One lucky donor won a \$25 card for free gasoline after the July 23 drive.

LifeSource honored the Westchester Blood Program group at an October 5th ceremony citing the top 20 blood programs in northern Illinois. In the 31 years since the program was founded, it has collected 19,755 units.

LifeSource needs 1,500 donations each day to keep up with the needs of the 160 Chicago area hospitals it serves.

Ninety per cent of the population will need donated blood at some point in their lives. Yet, fewer than 3% of eligible donors in the Chicago area donate The Gift of Life regularly. [Photo by Debra L. Solomon]

mobile driver services facility coming to westchester

Secretary of State Jesse White's Mobile Driver Services Facility will visit Westchester on Thursday, October 13 from 9:30 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. at the Westchester Village Hall, in the Community Room, 10300 Roosevelt Road.

The event is hosted by Westchester Village Trustee Angelo Luciano.

Among the services available: Vision screenings, written exams (CDL not available), duplicate license, corrected license, driver license renewal, identification cards, license plate renewal stickers for October, November and December 2005 only.

You do not have to be a Westchester resident or a senior to take advantage of these services!

Those wanting to secure an ID card for the first time will need to present three pieces of identification: your Social Security Card, a birth certificate and piece of mail showing current address.

As we welcome the autumn season, all residents are reminded that **regular branch pick up will end on Wednesday, November 23, 2005. Please note that Thursday's pick up will be made on Wednesday for the final pick up of the year.**

Any residents on alleys that have brush behind their houses or have been storing it in their yards are asked to bring it out to the street so we can pick it up before branch pick up ends! Branch pick up will resume in April 2006.

Also make a note that the **last pick up day for yard waste by Waste Management** will be Wednesday, November 30, 2005.

Parkway repairs due to Village Water Department excavations will be done, weather permitting, this season and will continue in Spring 2006.

LEAF BAG PROGRAM

Leaf bag distribution will begin on Monday, October 17, 2005. Hours are: Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and on Saturdays from 8 a.m. until Noon. Bags will be available on these Saturdays: October 22, October 29 and November 5, 2005. Leaf bags will be available in the Public Works rear garage of the Municipal Building at 10300 Roosevelt Road. ***This program is for residents only!***



One **FREE** pack of 10 bags will be given to each residence. Additional bags are available for purchase for \$3.50 per pack of 10 bags. Please note: If you are picking up leaf bags for your family members or neighbors, the full name, address and phone number will be required.

Residents are urged to cooperate by not raking leaves into the street. This causes many problems by blocking sewers and preventing the proper flow of storm water through the Village's sewer systems.

Leaves should be put into brown leaf bags provided by the Village or in cans for collection by Waste Management on regular yard waste pick-up days.

STREET DEPARTMENT

As always, it seems as if summer just flies by. The Street Department is always happy to be a big part of the summer events in Westchester. The parade is always super and our Fest is the best in the area and gets better every year. But now that fall and winter are here, we switch gears from patching and crack filling to leaf pick-up and snow and ice control.

Leaves are cleared from the streets by using a leaf vac and sweeper. All streets are cleared about once every two weeks. This can vary due to weather conditions. Please **DO NOT** rake all your leaves into the streets. Use the leaf bags available from Public Works! Raking into the streets causes sewer problems and unsafe driving conditions.

Now let's talk about snow. Last year—as in past years—Westchester's snow removal was rated #1 in the newspapers, as voted by the residents. Thank you for that vote of approval! It takes long hours and much money to have a good snow plan and to put it into action. Village officials and your Street Department recognize that the

safety and well-being of our residents cannot be measured in dollars. During a snowstorm, they are willing to spend the resources to ensure that our streets remain clear and dry. But we need your help! Please, remove cars from the street after three inches of snow, not only on snow routes, but on all streets. Every car that has to be plowed around leaves three spaces unplowed and slows down the plowing time.

Not only do cars need to be off the streets, but garbage cans also. Keep them behind the curb line and your streets will be clearer and your car won't get knocked over. We'll all have a safer, easier winter.

A reminder from your Water Department: Please do not put cooking grease or oils into your sink as it enters our system and creates a major problem. Put all grease and oils into a container or containers and dispose of it with your recycling.

If you are experiencing any sewer problems, contact the Water Department at 708-345-0041 and we will check to make sure the problem is not in our main lines.

As always, Village residents are asked to please call the Water Department at 708-345-0041 or 708-345-0060 (police non-emergency number) if an unusual or extreme amount of water is visible in the streets or parkways. This could be an indication of a possible main break that requires our immediate attention. We greatly appreciate your help!

All plumbers working in the Village of Westchester need a contractor's license from the Building Department plus a certificate of insurance. A permit is required to assure that codes are met and an inspection from our Water Department is necessary.

For new plumbing construction, residential or commercial, or for residents doing any plumbing remodeling themselves or by a plumbing contractor, please call John Fecarotta, Water Superintendent, at 708-345-0041 to verify codes and materials to be used.

Divine Providence begins 50th Year Celebration

Divine Providence Parish in Westchester will honor its 50 years as a faith community with a year-long celebration running from September 2005 through September 2006. On September 12, 1956, Divine Providence was established to serve the growing Catholic population west of Mannheim Road, with Father Walter McInerney as the founding Pastor, leading 459 families. Since then, the parish has grown and flourished under the leadership of its Pastors: Father John Dolciamore, Father John Rosemeyer and Father Tom Unz, along with the contribution of time, talent and treasure from thousands of dedicated parishioners.

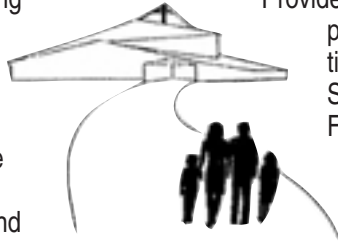
A 50th Anniversary is a time to celebrate and Divine Providence will do just that! The theme for the celebration is 50 Years: *Our Journey in Faith*. The year-long celebration began with a special opening liturgy on September 18, 2005 led by Bishop Thomas Paprocki and a reception in the McInerney Center, the original church.

The Jubilee Year will continue with special monthly masses led by priests who have been associated with Divine Providence.

These masses will honor key groups and individuals who have been an integral part of the history of Divine Providence. Among those to be recognized are the alumni of the parish school and the religious education program, charter members who helped form the parish, persons married and baptized at Divine Providence and others. An updated parish directory will be published during the anniversary year. The celebrations will conclude with the Anniversary Mass on September 24, 2006, presided over by Cardinal Francis George. The mass will be followed by a reception at the church and a dinner dance at Drury Lane in Oak Brook Terrace.

The Anniversary Committee is seeking the addresses of former parishioners who might want to join in this celebration. Everyone who has ever been a part of Divine Providence is very welcome to return and join the festivities.

Save the Prairie Society marks 30th Year



On June 30, 1975, the Save the Prairie Society (STPS) was incorporated. It had been founded in February 1974 at Lyons Township High School by individuals and organizations with environmental interests. Among them

were LaGrange Park Garden Club President Ruth Spevak; Lyons Township High School Biology teacher Jack Shouba and his wife; Northeastern Illinois University biology professor Robert Betz; Morton Arboretum Native Plants Curator Roy Schulenberg; Junior Woman's Club of Westchester Conservation Chairman Charlene Dolnics and co-founder Luella Krejci Seida.

Around 1970, the Chicago Open Lands Project had called attention to the importance of an 80-acre, near-virgin Wolf Road Prairie. Save the Prairie Society holds many of its activities at the Westchester-Hillside Civil War House, also known as the 1853 Franzosenbusch-Nelson House on Constitution Drive, at the northern border of the Prairie in Westchester. 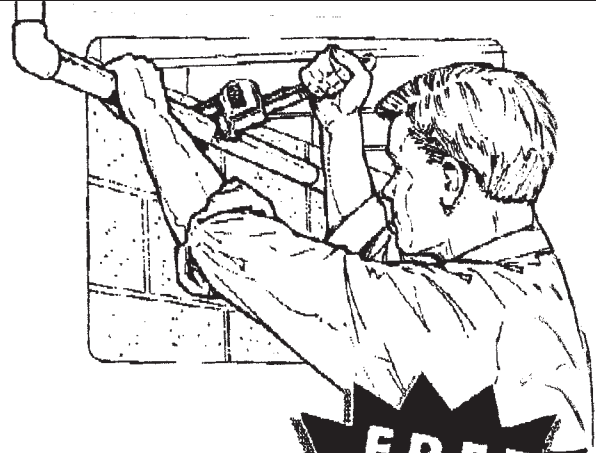
