From your Village President

Holiday greetings to all! I hope the New Year brings you and your family health, happiness and prosperity.

Village Hall

As you may have noticed, the front of the Village Hall is changing. We apologize for any inconvenience you may have endured while entering the Village Hall, but we made a promise that we would never close down the front entrance. We should be finished in early

spring and you will see a big difference in the appearance of the building. A big thank you to Cook County and the Community Development Block Grant Program that has made these improvements a reality.

We are looking for volunteers for planting and help in landscaping the front of the building. Anyone with a “green thumb” who would like to help in planting shrubbery or flowers—or if you have any suggestions to beautify the front of our Village Hall—please email me at presgattuso@westchester-il.org. I thank you for your input!



Planning

Our Economic Development Planner will be submitting his final plans to us in mid-January. We are looking forward to much-needed improvements and suggestions from our planner. Again, I must tell you that this takes time and cooperation from everyone. We do have a \$100,000 Illinois

Tomorrow Grant to start us off and hopefully we will be receiving the \$220,000 Corridor Grant that we applied for in early August. These two grants would give us \$320,000 to kick off our Economic Development efforts and we are very excited and anxious to move forward. I would like to take the opportunity to thank the Westchester Economic Development Committee for putting in the time and for making things run smoothly. Hopefully, this will be the start of the re-building of Westchester. Bear with us! This is just the beginning. We are optimistic that we will be able to address each area and get us back to where we should be.

Grant Money

If you remember from the last issue of our newsletter, we talked about a grant from Congressman Danny Davis in the amount of \$750,000 and a grant from Congressman Dan Lipinski in the amount of \$224,000. We have recently been informed that we receive these funds in early December 2006. This money must first go through the federal government, then state government channels then finally to our village, so this process takes a long time. I know our streets are in dire need of repairs. I also know that whatever streets we pick, we will get calls that another street should be on the list. Keep in mind that we only have so much money to work with and we will use this money as effectively as we can. We plan to repair streets, utilize heat scarification

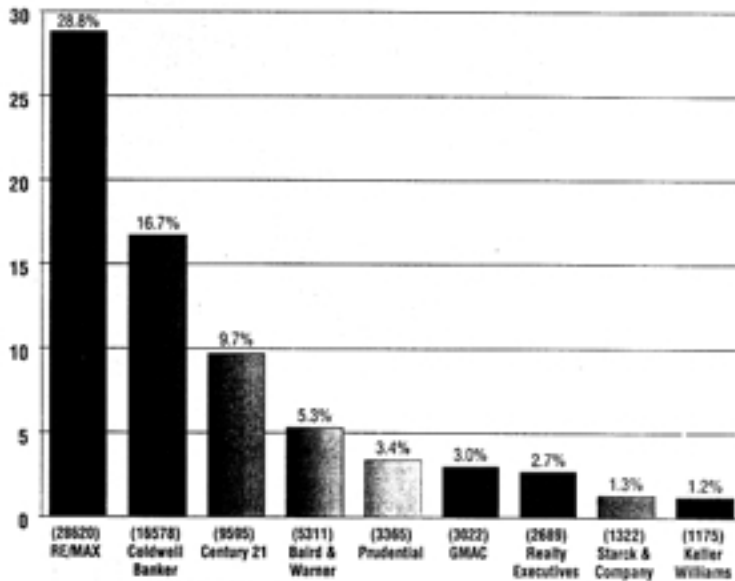

as well as work on some alleys. If you will notice the 15 streets that we have completed already, they have held up through our first snow season looking great. We will be talking more about the street program in future newsletters.

Phones and Computers

Just as important as our streets, we are looking to upgrade our telephone and computer systems at the village, which will provide residents with the convenience of paying their bills to the village online. Our phone system will be upgraded so you can leave a voicemail for me, members of the Board of Trustees or anyone in the village.

Water Meters

You may have read in the newspaper regarding the water meters and the revenue lost due to the fact that the outside ROMS are not able to keep up with the inside meters. The outside ROMS were installed as a convenience to residents so we would not have to enter the home to read the inside meters. Since the outside meters have not been able to keep up with the inside meters, there has been an accumulation of water being "lost." This has been an ongoing problem and we believe that the meter on the outside freezes and does not register quickly enough. Keep in mind, these meters were installed in the early 1980s!

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT DISTRICT 92-1/2 KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Kindergarten registration for the 2006-2007 school year will be on Monday, February 6, 2006. Doors open at 3:30 p.m. and registration begins at 6:30 p.m. at Westchester Primary School, 2400 South Downing. Registration ends at 7:30 p.m.

Packets will be available for pick up in the WPS School Office beginning Thursday, January 12, 2006 from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. It is not necessary to bring the child to registration.

Requests for morning or afternoon kindergarten sessions will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. Numbers will be passed out at registration. If you are unable to pick up a packet in the School Office, one will be available for you to complete on February 6th.

To register, the following information is required:

Completed registration packet with Certificate of Residence notarized; proof of residency in

District 92-1/2 through tax bill, mortgage statement, payment book, title or bill of sale. Renters should bring current original lease, driver's license, auto insurance statement, utility bill, with your name and address indicated; an official birth certificate (child must be 5 on or before September 1, 2006); child's social security number; and, if the child resides with a divorced parent, a copy of the custody and parenting portions of the official divorce or separation decree must be provided.

If residing in a relative's home, please call the School Office at 562-1509 for information.

Forms for required school physicals and dental exams will be included in the packets. These forms must be completed and turned in at registration in August. The dates and times for this registration and fee payment will be announced at a later date.

Westchester Blood Program

This month, the Westchester Blood Program begins its 32nd year of making miracles, literally saving lives. After collecting 501 units in 2005, enough to prolong the lives of 1,500 hospital patients, the Blood Program will hold its first blood drive of the new year on **January 21**—the 140th sponsored by the Westchester organization since its founding in July 1974. It will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Mayfair Room of Divine Providence School, 2500 Mayfair. In an effort to increase the turnout of donors, the Blood Program will give away at least one gift card for a free dinner at any Lettuce Entertain You restaurant, a gift from the popular dining chain.

The important goal, however, is to help Life-Source Blood Services maintain an adequate and safe supply of blood in hundreds of Chicago area hospitals. The Westchester Blood Program has collected 500 or more units during each of the last 16 years. But the number of donors has been dwindling; in the early 1980s, the total number of annual units was always above 700. So the need is great for healthy men and women above age 17 and weighing at least 110 pounds. Even people on medication usually are cleared to donate. In addition, merely the act of donating blood can cut the risk of cancer or heart attack, especially among middle-age men, by flushing the arterial system of dangerous iron.

Chicago area hospitals and trauma centers need 1,500 units of blood every day to keep up with the demands of scheduled and emergency surgeries. Despite this fact, fewer than 4 percent of healthy and eligible residents of the Chicago area donate blood regularly.

And, all the while, making a miracle is so easy.

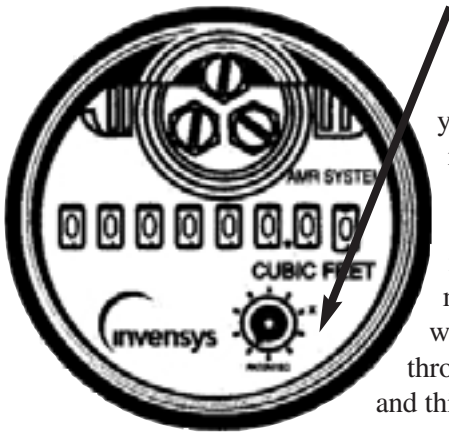

WATER LEAKS

The Village of Westchester Water Department has received numerous calls asking that the Meter Department come out and check for leaks in residents' homes. The calls are prompted by higher-than-normal water bills that some residents are receiving.

With the new meters that the village is installing, there is a feature on the dial of the meter that is specifically designed to let you—the resident—know if there are any leaks in your home. Those with new meters can readily see the red dial on the face of the meter (see the illustration).



If you know that you are not running any water and the dial indicator is moving, that means that there is water going through the meter and this will be

reflected as “used water” on your water bills. This also means that if you have a leak, the water being “used”—or in this case being lost—will be reflected on your bill and must be paid.

It is possible that a water leak in a single toilet can use at least two to four gallons of water a minute! This adds up to a lot of water and a lot of money, just within a 24-hour period. Leaking toilets, even a silent leak, will waste from 30 to 500 gallons of water per day!



Faucet Leakage Rates: 60 drops per minute = 192 gallons per month! The only remedy is to repair the leak—only then will you see a change in the amount of water used and the total dollar amount of your water bill. Remember, toilet leaks only get progressively worse....they do not fix themselves.

METERS & INSTALLATION

Watch for the yellow notice hanging on your home's door



The Village of Westchester is and has been in the process of changing all water meters. The new meters will be installed at no cost to the village's residents. One of the key aspects of the new meters is that Water Department meter readers will read them using a scanner, which eliminates errors in readings. With the elimination of errors in readings also comes the welcome elimination of erroneous high water bills.

Yellow notices hanging from doorknobs are being used to notify residents about new meter installation. When you find the yellow notice at your home, you will have to contact the village at 708-345-0041 to make an appointment at your convenience. Some Saturdays and evening hours are available.

The procedure of changing the inside and outside meter should not take any longer than 30 minutes; normally, it takes no more than 15 minutes. Please be mindful of the fact that the Village of Westchester municipal code includes an ordinance (#2.60.280) that states: “Village personnel must have access to all water meters.”

When you receive your yellow door hanger, please respond as quickly as possible! Thank you.

WATER DEPARTMENT

The cold weather has arrived so please note our winter warnings! Make sure that outside water spickets are turned off in the basement during the winter months to prevent pipes from freezing or cracking. If you are leaving town for warmer weather, please inform the Water Department so we can shut off the water at the Buffalo Box while you are away. Adopt a fire hydrant! Help keep the hydrant clear and clean of snow so that our snow plow drivers and the Fire Department can easily identify and quickly recognize the fire hydrant in the winter months.

As always, Village residents are asked to please call the Water Department at 708-345-0041 or 708-345-0060 (police non-emergency number) if an unusual or extreme amount of water is visible in the streets or parkways. This could be an indication of a possible main break that requires our immediate attention. We greatly appreciate your help! Residents are advised to contact the Water Department at 345-0041 before signing a contract with a plumber to rod the sanitary line. Our department will check to make sure the problem is not in our sanitary lines. All plumbers working in the Village of Westchester need a contractor's license from the Building Department plus a certificate of insurance. A permit is required to assure that codes are met and an inspection from our Water Department is necessary.

Please **DO NOT** put cooking grease or oils into your sink as it enters our system and creates a major problem. Put all grease and oils into a container and freeze it, then dispose of it with your garbage.



STREET DEPARTMENT

Thanks to all who cooperated with the 10" snowfall in December. Here are some helpful reminders that will assist us in keeping Westchester safe and clear:

Please remove all vehicles off the street after 2" of snowfall; every car left on the street leaves three spaces unplowed, often an inconvenience to your neighbors. Please do not shovel or snow blow snow into the street; this hinders the snow removal and has caused vehicle accidents.

Village ordinance prohibits all parking on snow routes after 2" of snow. Village ordinance prohibits parking on all other streets from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday–Friday after 2" of snow. Simply follow the signs that are posted on your street.

These ordinances are in effect in order to provide safe and efficient snow removal and violators will be ticketed. Remember also to keep your garbage cans off the streets.

FAQ: *When will my street be plowed?* Obviously all streets cannot be plowed at the same time. All streets are plowed and salted according to the following priority system: 1) Primary or snow routes; 2) Feeder streets; 3) Dead ends and cul-de-sacs; 4) Alleys. After the plowing is completed, repeat passes will be made to clean the streets curb to curb. Remember if you must be out during a storm, please drive carefully. Do not follow our equipment too closely and use caution if you must pass our trucks. *Have a Safe and Happy New Year!*

Village Ordinances

Ordinance No. 05-1681, amending Ordinance No. 90-1289 of the Westchester Municipal Code regarding dog and cat license fines. The fine for NOT purchasing a dog and/or cat license in the Village of Westchester shall be a minimum fine of \$100 up to a maximum fine of \$750.

Ordinance No. 05-1682, an ordinance relative to domestic and/or wildlife animals in the village. The Village of Westchester is not and cannot be responsible to trap or catch any animal, domestic or otherwise, within the corporate boundaries of the Village; when a complaint is received by the Village, it will refer the person to a professional agency licensed and insured to conduct such activities of trapping and catching and the like of any type of animal.

These ordinances are in full force now that they have been passed and they were unanimously approved by the Board.

STICKERS DUE ON VEHICLES BY FEBRUARY 15, 2006

Newly-acquired vehicles must be licensed within thirty (30) days of purchase. If vehicle stickers are not properly displayed by February 15, 2006, the owner is subject to a fine, in addition to fees being doubled.

Seniors: \$10 to seniors age 65 by 2/14/06. One per person. Dog tags are \$3 until February 28, 2006 and \$4 beginning March 1. Cat tags are \$4.

Newly-acquired dogs and cats must be licensed within 30 days after receiving their first rabies vaccine. Rabies certification must be presented upon registration.

The Village Hall will be open for your convenience on Saturdays, February 4th and 11th, 9 am to noon. Village Hall office hours on Monday through Friday are 8:30 am to 5 pm.

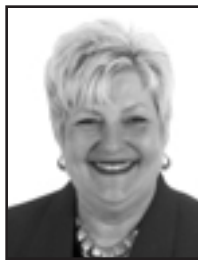

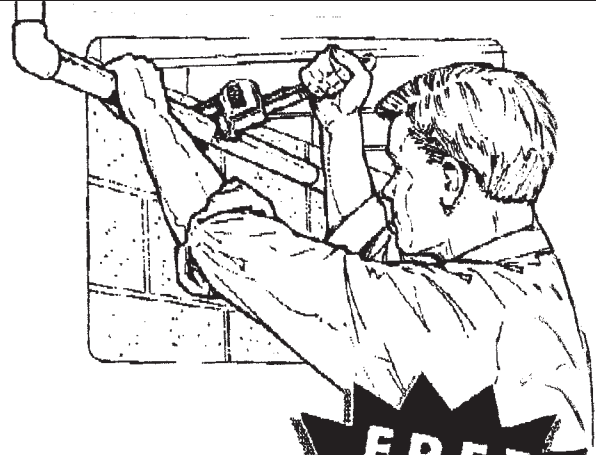
